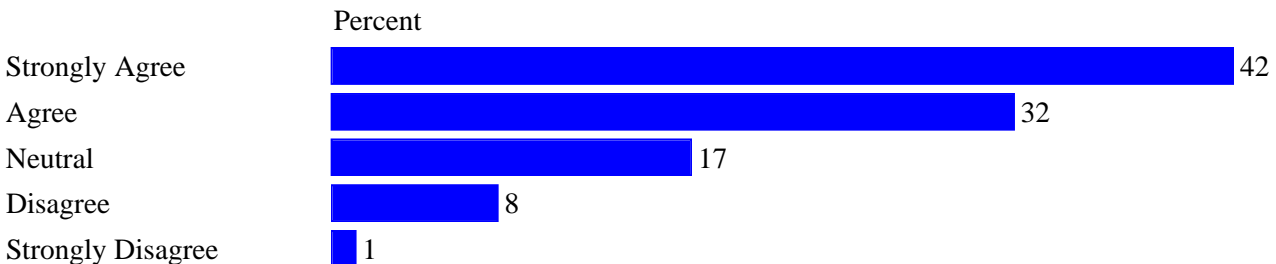

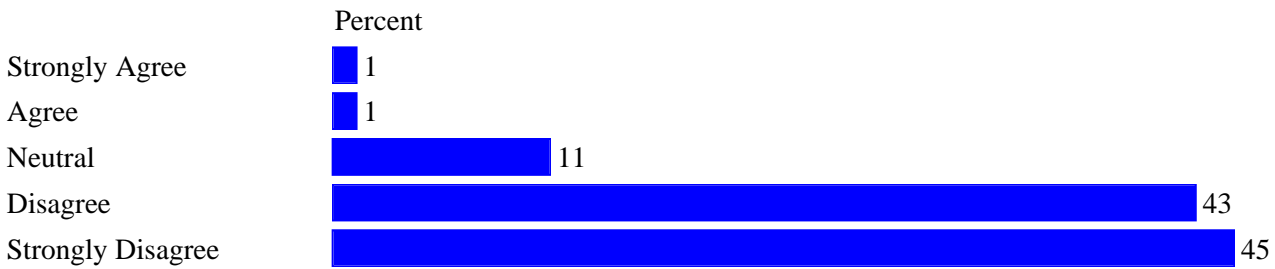

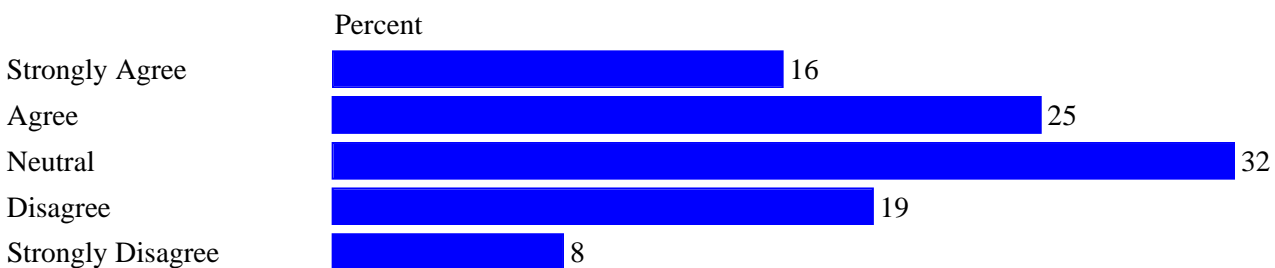

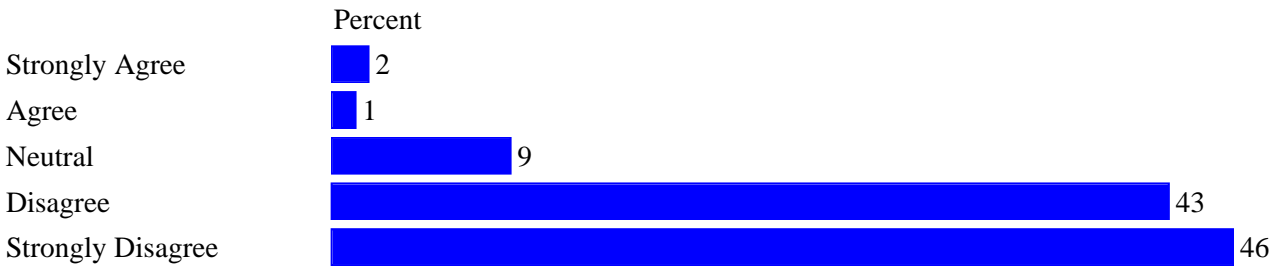

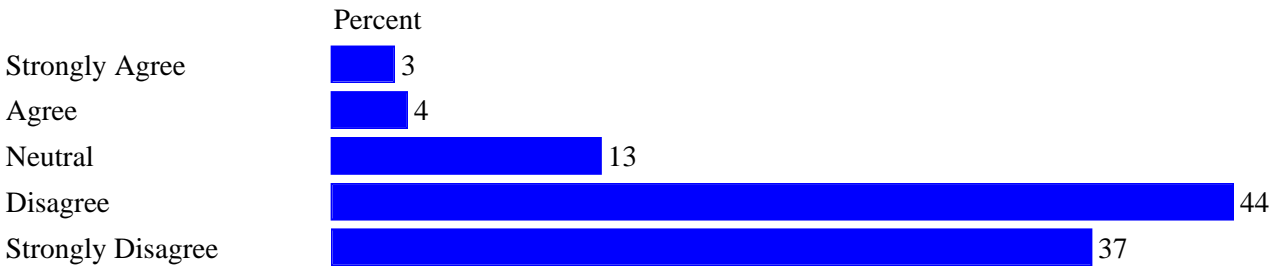

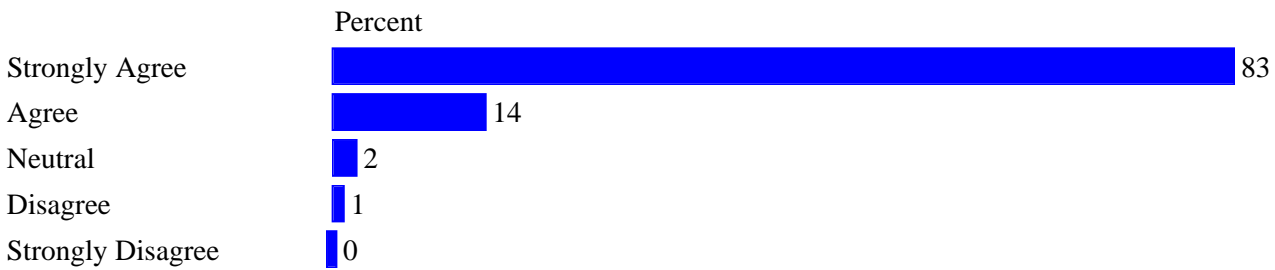

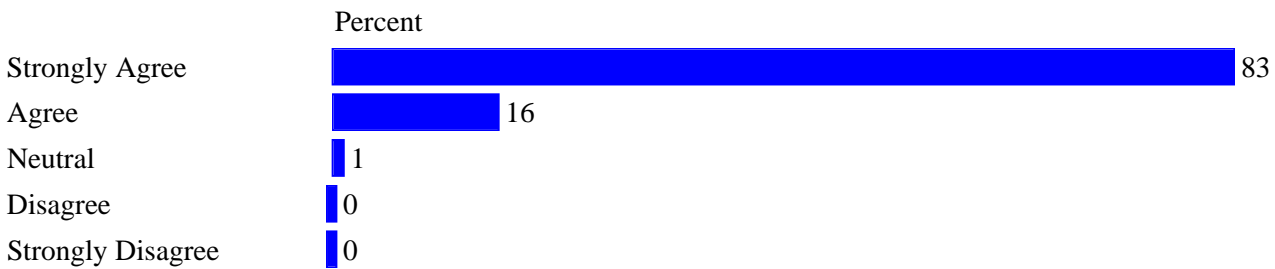

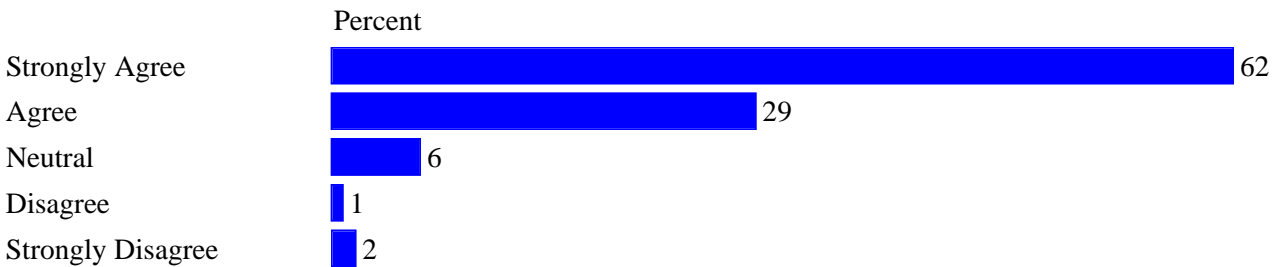

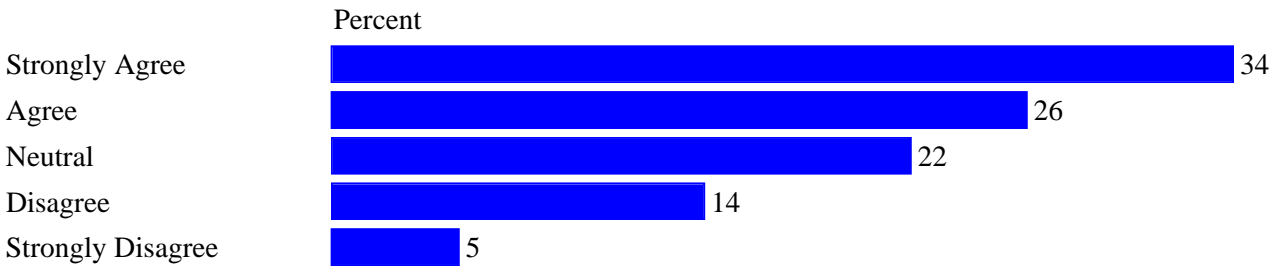

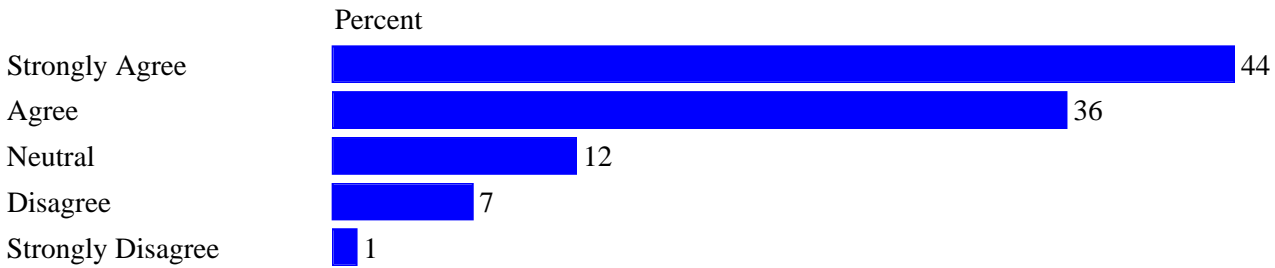

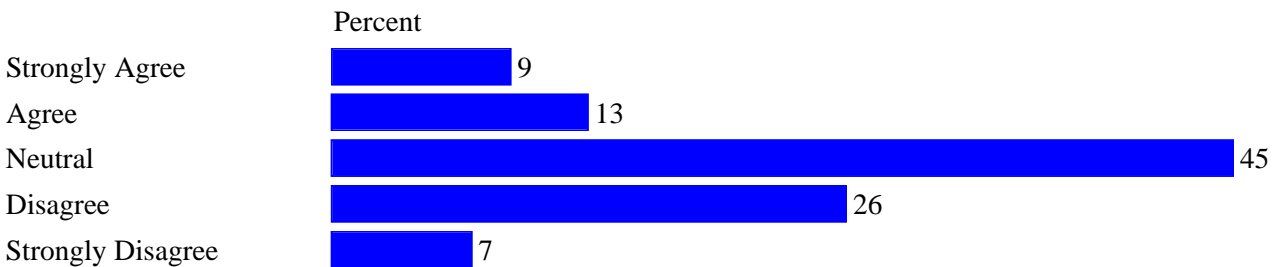

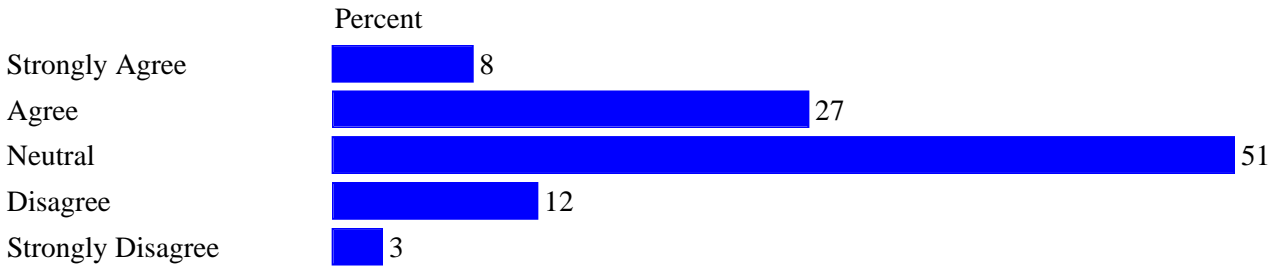

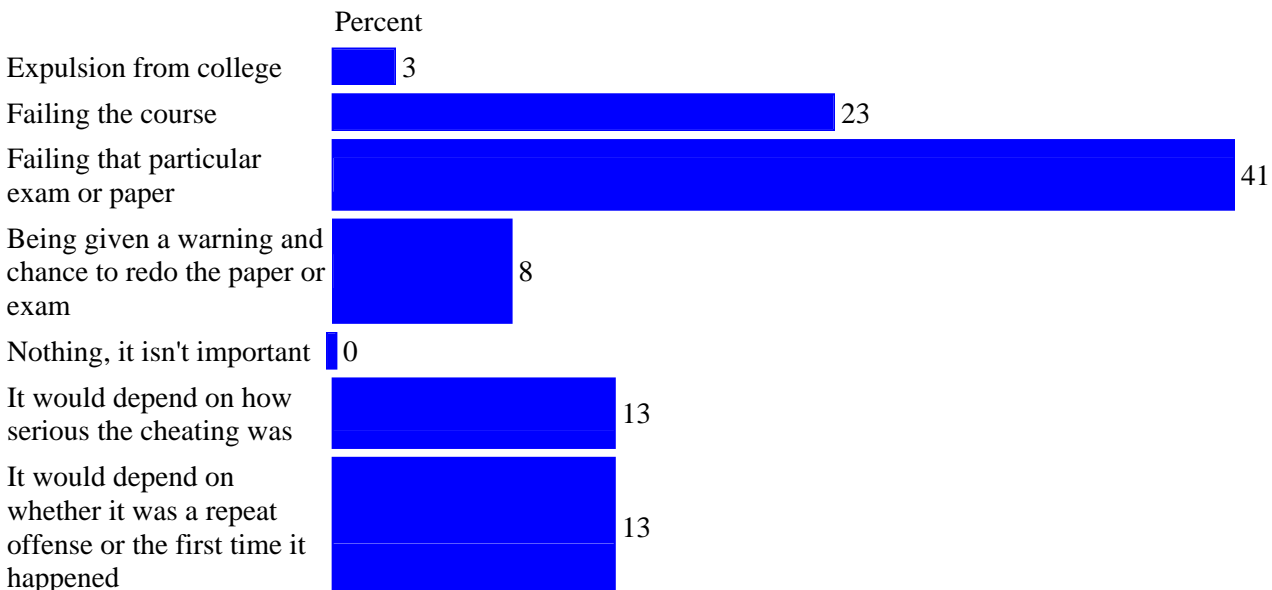

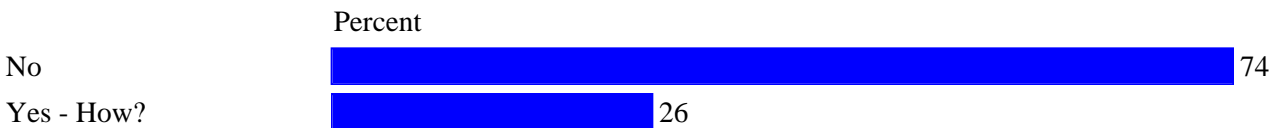
**22. Do you think that cheating is wide-spread enough to be considered a serious problem at MCC?**

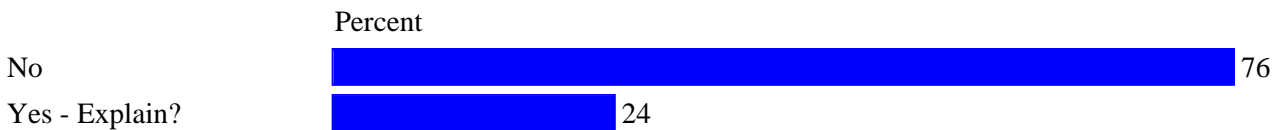

- If someone cheats, I think it should be reported. It isn't fair to anyone else and that is true especially if the instructor grades on a curve.
- Because that action could have an effect on me
- To let that instructor know what is going on right in front of them
- Everyone should have a moral obligation to their peers.
- The person doing the cheating should be punished for it in some way.
- I work hard for my grades.
- Because I feel like I'm letting them cheat and get away with it if I don't say anything.
- I work hard, so should everyone else.
- To enable a fair leaning experience.
- If they don't get caught the first time then they will do it over and over again so someone should tell the instructor
- Its only right!
